POSITION: Senior Program Director

Brushwood Center seeks a creative and experienced leader with a passion for the Lake County community, the environment, and the arts as well as mental health expertise to join our team as Senior Program Director. This is a senior leadership position with a vital role in shaping the on-the-ground impact of our mission. The Senior Program Director supervises a team of three full-time staff who coordinate Brushwood Center's community programs for youth, families, and Veterans, as well as the growing Health, Equity, and Nature Accelerator. Additionally, the Senior Program Director collaborates with Brushwood's artistic team to ensure continuity of impact across all program areas. The Senior Program Director works closely with Brushwood Center's Executive Director and Director of Development to advance the strategic goals and impact of the organization, including financial sustainability of programs.

ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- Oversee Brushwood's strategy for community and art programs, including program
 implementation, evaluation, communications, and mission alignment and DEIJ (Diversity, Equity,
 Inclusion, and Justice) connection of all programs;
- Apply mental health expertise to non-clinical program settings, i.e. informal afterschool programs, public programs, etc., and organizational strategy;

- Manage and assist staff in developing and evaluating annual youth education materials and curriculum in alignment with connected programming, including the Nature Explorer Backpack program;
- Manage and assist staff in programming, evaluation, and advisory council engagement for the At Ease program Veterans and the Military Community;
- Provide strategic support for the Health, Equity and Nature Accelerator to drive collaboration between the health and environment sectors, including the expansion of a community health worker training;
- Collaborate with Brushwood's Development team on grant writing and grant reporting;
- Develop and manage program budgets for At Ease, It's A W.I.N., and the Health, Equity, and Nature Accelerator;
- Cultivate strategic local, regional, and national partnerships, including with Lake County collaboratives and institutions;
- Engage in semi-annual planning sessions with all Directors;
- Coordinate with Brushwood artistic directors on public programs and events to ensure strategic program alignment;
- Manage direct reports including weekly check-ins and meeting facilitation with the Youth Education Coordinator, Veterans Program Coordinator, Coalition Building Manager, and relevant interns and seasonal staff;
- Assist with fundraising and speaking at events; and
- Additional staff support for programs and events as needed.

QUALIFICATIONS

We are seeking a dynamic, collaborative professional leader with at least five years of experience in management and community engagement. This individual will be creative, energetic, and highly organized. Key qualifications include the following:

- Bachelor's degree in Arts, Environment, Education, Health, or related degrees and Masters-level or higher education in Public Health, Social Work, Mental Health, OR significant experience and associated licensure in mental health-related professions;
- At least five years of work experience, preferably in a management setting;
- Documented leadership skills and ability to direct a diverse team across multiple projects and backgrounds;
- Excellent written, oral and interpersonal communication skills, including grantwriting and fundraising experience;
- Ability to manage and interpret quantitative and qualitative evaluation data collection processes, as relevant to program areas;
- Excellent organizational and time management skills and practiced problem solver;
- Strategic and creative in thinking and orientation, ability to deal with emergent issues, multiple projects, and constituents simultaneously;
- Experience in community engagement and coalition building, ideally experience in working with organizations/partners in Lake County, IL or surrounding area;
- Ability to lift program supplies or materials up to 30 lbs;
- Ability to work both independently and as part of a team;
- Ability to commute to Brushwood Center at Ryerson Woods, Brushwood Center North (Waukegan) and other meeting locations in the Chicago region;
- Proficiency in Spanish is not required, but preferred.
